- ♦ Please turn off all electronic devices before Mass begins. Thank you.
- ♦ This coming Wednesday is Ash Wednesday. Mass here at Sacred Heart that morning will be at 9:00 a.m. instead of 8:30 a.m. Also, the collection on Wednesday will be for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe. "This collection supports the Church in over 20 countries, many of which are still struggling to recover in the aftermath of Soviet rule. Funds from this collection support pastoral care, catechesis, building renovations, and seminary formation. Your support restores the Church and builds the future in this region. Please drop the envelope designated for this collection in the basket at the back of the church, or in the offertory basket at whatever church you may be attending. - ♦ As was mentioned above, Ashes will be distributed Wednesday here at Sacred Heart at the 9:00 a.m. Mass. If you are unable to attend that Mass, Ashes will also be distributed at the 7:30 a.m. Mass at St. Lawrence in South Wilmington, the 5:30 p.m. Mass at St. Mary's in Reddick and the 7:00 p.m. Mass at St. Lawrence in South Wilmington.
- ♦ Speaking of Lent... Lenten Regulations are as follows: 1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. 2. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. 3. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. 4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful. 5. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year. All of the faithful are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial (in addition to following the Lenten regulations), serious prayer, and a performance of works of charity and mercy.
- ♦ During the season of Lent, and in the spirit of the season, we will have a Food Pantry "Item of the Week" rather than just the usual Item of the Month. Please check the bulletin weekly to see what next week's item will be! Thank you!
