- ◆ “2016 MVK Food Pantry Report - Number of families helped: 32 (51 adults, 48 children). Size of families: 11 are senior, 9 are moms and kids, 12 are families. The Mazon-Verona-Kinsman Food Pantry continues to serve the families within our MVK School District. Most of our names come from We Care of Morris because they coordinate the need for food assistance in the area. We then contact them and set a date and time for them to come and pick up their food. We select from our shelves enough food for a family of that size and set all out on a table. They may choose what they will use and leave what they will not use. We also give personal care items, paper goods, and household cleaning supplies. Our freezer holds hamburger, chicken, hot dogs, cheese slices and bread.
