- ◆ Courtesy of the Diocese of Springfield...some thoughts during this Jubilee Year of Mercy - May 22, 2016 - **“The Trinity**. In making Creole recipes, that is, authentic New Orleans food, every cook knows ‘the trinity’ - celery, onions, green pepper. They are essential. They are the starting point. Properly prepared, they blend as one, yet retain distinctive flavors. So, too, God. Triune. Blended yet distinct [the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, no. 202 states it this way: ‘only one true God...three persons indeed, but one essence, substance or nature entirely simple’]. *What must I do to ‘flavor’ the world in which I live? *How can I be like God and not see myself standing alone, acting alone, being alone?”
