- ◆ Courtesy of the Diocese of Springfield...some thoughts during this Jubilee Year of Mercy - November 20, 2016 - **“What does the Kingdom of God look like?** We pray today in the Preface at the outset of the Eucharistic Prayer for a kingdom of truth and life, a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love and peace. We know and we believe that we get glimpses of it all. Right here, right now. We practice for Kingdom of heaven living after death by Kingdom living now. The mercy works are cherished methods, splendid ways to do this.

Corporal Works of Mercy - These are charitable actions by which we help our neighbors in their bodily needs. The corporal (bodily) works of mercy are: *Feed the hungry. *Give drink to the thirsty. *Shelter the homeless. *Clothe the naked. *Visit the sick. *Visit the prisoners. *Bury the dead. *Give alms to the poor. *Pope Francis adds: Care of our Common Home.

Spiritual Works of Mercy - These are actions that help our neighbor in their spiritual needs. They include: *Counseling the doubtful. *Instructing the ignorant. *Admonishing the sinner. *Comforting the sorrowful. *Forgiving injuries. *Bearing wrongs patiently. *Praying for the living and the dead. *Pope Francis adds: Care of our Common Home.
