◆ The initial stages of the 2015 MVK Christmas Basket Project have begun with the collection of nonperishable food items. Items can be brought in and left on or by the card table in the back of the church now through Sunday, Nov. 22nd. Gift Tags are also out. Please return all gifts, unwrapped but with tags attached, as soon as possible. Thank you!

◆ The Rectory will be closed this coming Tuesday, Nov. 10th.

◆ Let's get this Census project taken care of, shall we?!.....If you haven't already done so, please pick up your Census envelope from the box on the card table in the back of the church, look it over, and make any and all corrections needed. ◆ Final totals are in on the Golf Outing and the Hog Raffle for 2015. First of all, the Golf Outing profit was \$6,681.27!!! (A little tidbit in regards to the Golf Outing (**please note: the Hog Raffle profit not included in these totals**)...2014's profit was \$6,356.86, 2013's profit was \$5,083.59 and 2012's profit was \$4,933.98 - so it looks like we are gradually increasing every year! Pam is posting a sheet in the back of the church indicating the amount each category made, such as silent auction, 50/50, marshmallow game, etc....along with a list of expenses. The final figures are also in on the 2015 Hog Raffle. With donations of the hog, processing of the hog, envelopes, postage, photos for the collage and thank you's and a cash donation of \$120.00, the only expense for the raffle was \$65.10 for the cost of printing the raffle tickets. There was \$3,600.00 in tickets sales. After deducting \$65.10 from the ticket sales figure....that leaves a profit of \$3,654.90!!! A note was included with the Hog Raffle information.... "Way to go! 4th Annual Hog Raffle - A SUCCESS!! The highest profit to date - beat the 1st year by \$53.80!! Copies will be posted on the back bulletin board. Thanks again for everyone's help! God Bless! Enjoy the new sound system!! The Yaskos." According to my calculations....\$6,681.27 + \$3,654.90 = \$10,336.17 = another successful fund raising effort by everyone involved!!! Special thanks, once again, to Dave & Pam Brockman and Jim & Peg Yasko for all your hard work again this year!!! We don't know what we'd do without you!!!

◆ Stewardship - November 8, 2015 - Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time - "Today's Scripture reading from the First Book of Kings and St. Mark's Gospel are linked by two widows' extraordinary examples of sacrifice. In the Old Testament passage, the prophet Elijah asks a poor widow, in the midst of a drought, to prepare him food out of her meager supply of flour and oil. God blesses her and her son abundantly for her simple generosity. In St. Mark's Gospel, Jesus observes the poor widow who gives all she has to the Temple treasury. Jesus proclaims to His disciples that her contribution is significant because she gives from her need, not her surplus wealth as others did. We discover in the letter to the Hebrews another form of sacrifice: Christ's sacrifice of Himself as our High Priest. As Christian stewards, we should strive to imitate these profound examples of sacrificial giving by serving our parish communion, discerning God's call in our lives, and by giving back to God through our parish offertory, the Catholic Services Appeal, and to those in need."
