- ◆ There will be a second collection next Sunday, as described by Bishop Conlon in a letter he wrote to the parish priests in the Diocese of Joliet this past week.... “My brother priests: I am sure you are all aware the terrible devastation wrought by Hurricane Matthew to the Caribbean nations, particularly Haiti, and to our own southeastern states. With as many as 900 killed in Haiti and tens of thousands of homes destroyed, Catholic Relief Services, the international relief agency of the U.S. Catholic Church, is responding in Haiti and the other Caribbean nations with kitchen and hygiene kits and other emergency supplies as needed, as well as responding to outbreaks of cholera and other diseases. Here, closer to home, Catholic Charities USA, working in partnership with diocesan Catholic Charities agencies across the region, is providing critical disaster relief services to the thousands impacted by the massive flooding. We, in the Diocese of Joliet, recall their financial assistance during several of the damaging tornados in recent years. I am writing to ask you to encourage parishioners to join us in prayer for our sisters and brothers in their time of suffering. **Further, I write to ask also that you take up a second collection the weekend of November 5-6, 2016.** These funds will support the efforts of both Catholic Relief Services and Catholic Charities USA. ... I thank you all for your cooperation and prayers. Most Reverend R. Daniel Conlon Bishop of Joliet.”
