- ◆ Stewardship - September 27, 2015 - Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time - "In today's second reading, St. James condemns the wealthy for withholding wages from their laborers and selfishly accumulating treasures and wanton luxuries on earth. Wealth in itself is not necessarily bad. But Christian stewards belong to Christ, acknowledge that all blessings come from God, and are nourished in a spirit of gratitude. St. Mark, in his Gospel, describes how giving someone a drink of water is an example of discipleship in Christ. In that spirit, we are inspired to return a generous portion of our God-given gifts back to the Lord through service to our parish and the poor. We can return our monetary gifts to the Lord through our parish offertory, the Catholic Services Appeal, those in need, and other worthy causes."
