In these times, the Pontifical Good Friday Collection is necessary to meet the basic needs of the People of God still living in this Land and to maintain a Christian presence where the Church was born. - Christ’s Passover - Immaculate Conception Parish of Braidwood is hosting Christ’s Passover this Lenten season on Wednesday, April 5, 2023 at 6:30 pm in the parish hall. The public is invited to attend and participate in this free event.
