- Second Collection today – Peter’s Pence – as was stated in Bishop Hick’s letter last week...”We will soon take up a collection for Peter’s Pence, which provides essential support for the Holy See’s activities and helps Pope Francis assist the victims of wars, oppression and natural disasters around the world. The Holy Father’s ministry of mercy this spring has aided victims of a situation with which we are all too familiar: the war in Ukraine. Pope Francis in March donated a fully equipped ambulance to the city of Lviv, the Ukrainian city closest to the Polish border where many refugees have sought shelter. Earlier that month, the pope donated medical supplies – such as syringes, bandages, disinfectants and other products – to Ukrainian refugees. Please prayerfully consider supporting this year’s Peter’s Pence collection during the weekend of June 25-26 as an act of mercy and charity. Let us live out the words of Pope Francis expressed in Fratelli Tutti: “I should no longer say that I have neighbors to help, but that I must myself be a neighbor to others.” (Paragraph 81) Paz y bien, Most Reverend Ronald A. Hicks, Bishop of Joliet.”
