Collection bins will be in the back of the church. Examples of items needed are: Personal Hygiene Bathroom Misc.: Bath/Body/Hand Soap, Shampoo/Conditioner, Razors/Shaving Cream, Deodorant, Q-tips, Hair Brushes, Nail Clipper, Toothbrushes/Toothpaste/Mouthwash. Bathroom: Shower Curtain, Toilet Paper, Plunger, Toilet Brush, Toilet Bowl Cleaner, Shower/Tub Cleaner, Bath Mat, Bath Towels, Washcloth, Air Freshener, Clothes Hamper, Trash Can. Misc.: Laundry Detergent, Laundry Basket, Dryer Sheets, Garbage Bags, Silverware, Dishes/Bowls, Pots and Pans, Kitchen Towels/Hot Pads, Broom and Dustpan, Kitchen Cleaner, Swiffer Mop/Duster, Kitchen Garbage Can, Paper Towels, Cutting Board.
- A message from parishioner Donna Gabehart....I got a call out from Wreaths Across America - Elwood. This is a huge undertaking every year. They have videos on Facebook showing the trucks lined up for at least a mile or so coming in bringing wreaths if you would like to see what it’s like that day. It’s amazing. This is a great project for adults and kids of all ages to come and help somehow. I think they also sign off on volunteer sheets for the kids to get their hours credited. They did last year. Wreath Guards: For this position you must be able to commit to 8am - approximately 2pm to stay at a certain section at the cemetery to hand out sponsorship forms and wreaths. You don’t have to sign up for placing wreaths. All are welcome and much needed. Thank you all! This is a large team effort to make it all happen and cannot do it without you!”
