Second Sunday in Lent Weekend of February 20/21, 2016 -In today's second reading we learn that one of Saint Paul's principles of Christian living is to watch and imitate other followers of Christ. This pattern includes a life of prayer, selflessness, sacrifice, and caring for others, including our family of faith. Good stewards choose their friends wisely. They cultivate friendships with other Christian stewards, spend time with them, observe how they live, ask questions about their faith and learn from them. Who are your friends? Are they good stewards of their faith? Are they those who can help you on your own journey of faith?
