Fourth Sunday of Lent Weekend of March 5/6, 2016 -Today we hear one of the most beloved stories in the Gospel of Luke, Jesus' parable of the Prodigal Son. Reconciliation is a prominent theme. Seeing the younger son returning to him, the son who left the family and squandered his in-heritance, the compassionate father runs to embrace him. Jesus offers us a vision of a loving God who is merciful and forgiving, welcoming us back when we remorsefully return to him. When was a time that I left God's presence through my own sinfulness? Did I humbly and sorrowfully repent of my actions? How am I using this time of Lent to humbly atone for my sins? Will I eagerly celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation in the next few weeks to experience God's loving embrace and forgiveness?



Names do define us. There is a lot of name calling in the Bible readings proclaimed today. "Brothers and sisters" – those bound together in Christ. "New creation" – those drowned in baptismal waters washing away original life.
