June 17-18, Father's Day Collection for Infirmed & Retired Priests - Diocese of Joliet.

This annual collection is not to be confused with the annual collection for Retired Religious, which typically asks for donations in December and is geared specifically for religious order priests and nuns (for instance, Carmelite, Franciscan, Benedictine, Augustinian, Viatorian, etc.). The Fund for Diocesan Infirmed and Elderly Priests is aimed specifically at the diocesan priests in the Diocese of Joliet, and the collection for that takes place annually during the Father's Day weekend Masses at parishes throughout the diocese. The money for the fund goes toward those priests who need help with extraordinary medical expenses or have a catastrophic illness that leads to costs above and beyond what insurances can cover. With more priests getting older, the fund acts as a vivid reminder to them – and the people they have served over the years – that they will not be forgotten. It also acts as a way to remind parishioners that the support system that many lay Catholics have - spouses or children who can take care of them when they get sick - often times doesn't exist for celibate men who have spent years serving others. Often times, when senior priests, dealing with aging issues or illness, are no longer affiliated with a specific parish, the support network that comes from parishioners is no longer present.

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity Weekend of June 10/11, 2017

In today's second reading Saint Paul's final appeal is a call for unity. God created that unity.
