Short meditation for ADVENT-Cultivating SOUL -The grass in meadowlands has to be mown every year, and some cases even at every recurring season. All these things recur unheeded, and, little by little, the soul is blinded, grace loses its power, passion increases and finally triumphs.

God comes. What shall we do? God, indeed, is coming. Near at hand. At the door. Be busy! Be lovingly-kind, like God. Do mercy work. Being merciful does not require extraordinary behavior. The gospel offers some suggestions: clean out the closet, share from the pantry, do not take what others need. Do mercy. Be mercy.
