Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary – Saturday, 08 December 2018 God comes to favor us. From the beginning days in Eden, the man was assured by God not to hide. Clothing helped. From the beginning new days, God's angel tells Mary: Do not fear – God favors you – the Spirit will do holy things in you – nothing is impossible! How can this be? By God's grace and mercy.

• What favor has God found in me?

Second Sunday of Advent – 09 December 2018 God knows where we are – and comes. This is divine revelation: God coming, God showing, God being with us. Always! Let us, therefore, wear the cloak of justice and the hat of God's glorious splendor. That is, let us still dress like Christ – just as we were first clothed in him at Baptism – and radiate his presence – just as we were first illumined by him in that sacramental bath.

- John the Baptist calls us, today, to conversion. What will I do?
- How can I wear mercy like a comfortable cloak, a well-worn hat?
- How can my daily life shine in more merciful ways?

Second Sunday of Advent Weekend of December 8/9, 2018-In today's second reading, Saint Paul prays with joy and confidence for his friends in the Christian community at Philippi. He is encouraged that the community has partnered with him to proclaim the Gospel. He sees Christ's active presence and plan of salvation at work in the community. God's overarching plan is unclear to us. But when we see evidence of God working through others, doesn't it give us reason to hope that Christ is alive among us? Does the witness of others help our own prayer lives? Does it inspire us to be partners with others in promoting the Gospel? Food for thought in this second week of Advent.
