Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time Weekend of June 16/17, 2018 -In today's Gospel, Jesus compares the beginning of God's kingdom to a mustard seed. The church, which began with about 120 followers, added three thousand people on Pentecost Day following the descent of the Holy Spirit. Good stewards go about God's business of "planting seeds" among all those whom they encounter. What will we do this week to add to God's kingdom?
