**Declaration of Independence** – On June 12, 1775, one year before the Declaration of Independence was written, the Continental Congress issued what has come to be called a "Declaration of Dependence upon God." The document reads in part: "This Congress – does earnestly recommend that Thursday, the twentieth day of July next, be observed by the inhabitants of all the English Colonies on this continent as a day of public humiliation, fasting and prayer; that we may with united hearts and voices unfeignedly confess and deplore our many sins, and offer up our joint supplications to the all-wise, omnipotent, and merciful disposer of all events, humbly beseeching Him to forgive our iniquities and remove our present calamities." It is a reasonable assumption that, because of this Declaration of Dependence, God's favor moved upon the hearts of the brave men of that day, producing the great Declaration of Independence. Perhaps the historic past can teach us lessons for our troubled present. –Ross W. Hayslip
