

September, 2018 Report from St. Mary's Finance Committee/ October 14 Utility Collection:

Our Finance Committee for St. Mary's met in April to finalize the 2018 budget for our church. Our new budget year begins annually on July 1. The committee has regular meetings in order to carefully monitor St. Mary's income and expenses.

As of June 30, 2018 our parish had a total overall deficit of \$2,464.50. Our utility and maintenance costs continue to rise and our church income must as well. Last year utilities for our building and our 20% of the rectory were \$4,863.68. Our first collection of the year that is used to defray our utility expenses will be the weekend of October 14th. (A green envelop is included in your box for this collection.)

We want to thank all of our parishioners who have donated generously in the past to our October and March utility collections. **The money from these collections is designated entirely for the care and maintenance of St. Mary's of Reddick.** Thank you for your support; it is the reason our church continues to thrive.
