September 2019, Report from St. Mary's Finance Committee/ October 13 Utility Collection: The Finance Committee for St. Mary's met in March to finalize the 2019-2020 budget for the church. The new budget year began on July 1. The committee had their first meeting of the new budget year this past week with Lin Hopwood and Fr. Stanley. It is the job of the Finance Committee to establish a yearly budget and monitor St. Mary's income and expenses. We have good news to report this year. St. Mary's is growing! Due to that growth and the generosity of our parishioners, we were able to achieve our budget last year! If you would like a copy of the 2018-2019 Financial Report it is available upon request by calling Lin at the parish office. During the weekend of October 13, we will have our first utility collection for the new budget year. (A green envelop is included in your box for this collection.) Last year utilities for our building and 20% of the rectory were \$5,081.19. The money from this collection and the second collection in March is used to defray our utility expenses. We want to thank all of our parishioners who have donated generously in the past to our two yearly collections. The money from these collections is designated entirely for the care and maintenance of St. Mary's of Reddick. Thank you for your support; we've made great progress!

Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4. Psalm 95:1-2, 6-7, 8-9. 2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14. Luke 17:5-10.

**Size matters.** There is a lot to chew on today. Habakkuk accuses God of not listening, not helping (me, too, at times)! Saint Paul tells the beloved (and all of us) to stir into flame the gift(s) of God. The apostles ask for increased faith. For disciples – that is us, for we do follow – Jesus infers that size matters. Little mustard-seed-size faith must be planted. With nurturing, so it grows. As faith grows, so does discipleship.
