New Years Day Mass (Solemnity of Mary) this is a Holy Day of Obligation

Blessing of a Home—Although there are fine texts for the blessing of homes, neither the Book of Blessings nor Catholic Households Blessings and Prayers explains the traditional method for blessing homes this day using incense, chalk (an incarnational image because it reminds us of the dust of the earth from which we were made), and "Jordan water." The chalk is used to mark over doorways. The numerals consecrate the new year. The initials remind us of the legendary names of the magi—Casper, Melchior, and Balthasar—and also stand for the Latin motto Christos mansion benedict ("May Christ bless the house").

Program for NEW YEAR—DAILY PLAN—LIFE God's man lives, moves, has his being in God. The Christian who would live Godly always must have a rule or pattern of life. Here is a suggestion: Participate daily in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Make everything—work, play, prayer-share in It: Ite, Missa Est! Feast daily in the Eucharist-Christ is your Great Friend-take Him with you. Make daily conversation with Christ—mental prayer-aim for 15 minutes, settle for no less than five, on busiest days. Receive the Sacrament of Penance biweekly, with a regular confessor if possible. Seek spiritual direction. Pray Our Lady's Rosary daily, devoutly. Use opportunities to increase knowledge of our Holy Faith: courses, lectures, discussion clubs, books, sermons
