Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) - 23 Jun 2019

Genesis 14:18-20. Psalm 110:1, 2, 3, 4. 1 Corinthians 11:23-26. Sequence – Lauda Sion / Laud, O Zion. Luke 9:11b-17. **Eating and drinking.** Luke's gospel is filled with stories of dining in the Kingdom of God. Jesus is willing to eat with anyone. Today he feeds about five thousand men – who knows how many women and children. Such abundance! All of this gospel eating and drinking foreshadows the Last Supper (recounted in the Second Reading today and in every Eucharistic Prayer), which sets the table for dining at Sunday Eucharist week after week.

- Eat and drink Body and Blood. Why do I want to do both each Sunday?
- Even if resources seem meager, how can I trust the abundance of God?
- How will the mercy works of feeding and of giving drink guide my actions this week?
