Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time – 30 June 2019

1 Kings 19:16b, 19-21. Psalm 16:1-2, 5, 7-8, 9-10, 11. Galatians 5:1, 13-18. Luke 9:51-62.

Traveling to Jerusalem. Today, Saint Luke tells us that Jesus travels, that is, "sets his face" toward Jerusalem. On the way, he challenges three more people about following him.
