Our Lady of Guadalupe, Feast – 12 December We do not celebrate this patronal feast of the Americas this year because the Third Sunday of Advent is of higher rank and takes precedence.

Third Sunday of Advent – 12 December 2021 Zephaniah 3:14-18a. Isaiah 12:2-3, 4, 5-6. Philippians 4:4-7. Luke 3:10-18. Exhorting and Expecting. Even in these troubled times, we are urged to rejoice this day, this week, this season. The question posed by nearly everyone to John the Baptist – What should we do? – is also our question. Saint Paul reminds us that the Lord is near. While we <u>actively</u> wait for Jesus Christ to come again, we are told to be merciful and just. What in my closet can be given to clothe someone in need? What actions in my job or my retirement can be fairer and more just? What words from my mouth will speak only truth?
