Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time – 06 February 2022 Isaiah 6:1-2a, 3-8. Psalm 138:1-2, 2-3, 4-5, 7-8. 1 Corinthians 15:1-11. Luke 5:1-11. Believing Christ's Rising. Isaiah and Luke relate stories of being called to do God's work. Paul, in the second reading, recounts the Good News in which we stand and in which we are saved. Namely: Jesus died, was buried, was raised on the third day, and then appeared to many. He is with us still. How do I experience the risen Christ in daily life? My life? Other's lives? How will I "press in on Jesus" (Luke) to hear his saving words? From what does this Christ save me this day? Then tomorrow? Then the next day?
