St. Mary's Fall Utility Collection-The St. Mary's Finance Committee/Parish Council met during this past spring to finalize the 2022-2023 budget. The new budget year began on July 1, 2022. The committee met again on August 30 to review the 2021-2022 Financial Report. The good news is St. Mary's was able to stay within our budget! Without your generous contributions, and the members who volunteer their time and services to our parish, this would not have occurred. The first of our two utility collections for the new budget year will be on October 8. Last year, utilities for our building and 20% of the rectory were \$5,805.63. We anticipate an increase this year due to overall higher energy costs. The money from this collection and the second collection in March is used to defray this expense. Thank you to all of our parishioners who have donated generously to the two utility collections in the past! These collections directly benefit St. Mary's of Reddick. If you would like a copy of the 2021-2022 Financial Report, it is available upon request by calling the parish office.
