Fifth Sunday of Lent – 26 March 2023 Ezekiel 37:12-14. Psalm 130:1-2, 3-4, 5-6, 7-8. Romans 8:8-11. John 11:1-45. Dying with Christ; Dying to Self. Even when his friends are disappointed with him and his disciples misunderstand him, Jesus is clear and resolute. No one's death is everlasting. We believe that just as Baptism graces us with new life in Christ, physical death transmits us to newer life with God for ever. What "death" is sucking the life out of me? What will I do about it? What will I do, as one loved by Christ beyond all measure, for those in need of mercy works? How will I be a sign of Christ-filled life for the elect preparing for Easter Baptism?
