Eucharistic Adoration- Everyone is invited to adore Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament at the Church of St. Lawrence in South Wilmington every **1st Wednesday of the month**, the next adoration will be **Sept. 6 from 11am – 1pm**. Please try to find time for Jesus in Adoration. Come by and visit with Jesus even if it's only 10–15 minutes.

The Church dedicates the month of September to Our Lady of Sorrows. This devotion recalls the Blessed Virgin Mary's spiritual martyrdom in virtue of her perfect union with the Passion of Christ. This was her role in salvation history, and what merited her place as the spiritual Mother of all Christians. This is symbolized by a single sword, or seven swords, piercing Mary's suffering heart, as foretold in Simeon's prophecy. Traditionally the Church meditates on the "Seven Sorrows" of our Blessed Mother: the prophecy of Simeon; the Holy Family's flight into Egypt; the loss of the Child Jesus for three days; the meeting of Mary and Jesus as he carried his cross; Jesus' crucifixion and death; Jesus' sacred body taken down from the cross; and Jesus' burial. The feast of Our Lady of Sorrows is September 15th.

The Prairie Singers will present their 36th annual concert series this September. The concert for this fall is titled "Look at the World." A variety of music including Broadway, religious, autumnal, patriotic and folk tunes will be presented. There will be two concerts offered in September as the singers return to a fall schedule. The first concert will be at 2 p.m. Sunday, Sept. 10, at St. Patrick's Catholic Church, 176 W. Union St., <u>Seneca</u>. The second presentation will be at 6:30 p.m. Monday, Sept. 11, at the Prairie Creek Public Library, 501 Carriage House Lane, Dwight. Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time –3 September 2023 Jeremiah 20:7-9. Psalm 63:2, 3-4, 5-6, 8-9. Romans 12:1-2. Matthew 16:21-27. **Overcoming Obstacles.** Jeremiah complains that because of the compelling presence of God within, he cannot **not** speak God's message. Paul urges us not to conform ourselves to **this** age. And Peter, trying to protect Jesus, blurts out "God forbid" and becomes an obstacle to Jesus' mission. Baptized followers of Jesus must **deny**, take up the **cross**, and **follow**. In denying self, how will I attend to another's need this week? What is the cross I bear for the sake of the Kingdom of Heaven? How will I follow, not the greed of this age, but the goodness of Christian life?
