
Undy Sunday-Thank you to all our parishioners who brought donations for Unday Sunday and for making a difference in the lives of the poor and vulnerable in our community!

Mt. Olivet fall Cleanup-Starting Nov. 2. Please remove any items you wish to keep, including shepherds hooks, before Nov. 2. Statues of any kind are not permitted in any part of the cemetery and will be removed. Shepherds hooks may not be placed in cemetery during winter months. New decorations can be put out after cleanup.

All Saints, Solemnity – Friday, 01 November 2019 Revelation 7:2-4, 9-14. Psalm 24:1-2, 3-4, 5-6. 1 John 3:1-3. Matthew 5:1-12a.
