Fifth Sunday of Easter – 19 May 2019

Acts 14:21-27. Psalm 145:8-9, 10-11, 12-13. Revelation 21:1-5a. John 13:31-33a, 34-35.

The love command. Today, Paul and Barnabas proclaim Good News. John sees a new heaven and a new earth. Jesus tells us how to live within this resurrected reality: love one another. Short. Not always easy. But profound. Fr. - How has God loved me?
- Who will I choose to love? What will I do?
- Doing mercy work is a perfect way to manifest the love command. What will I do this week?
