Jesus our Redeemer, You showed us how to attain eternal life by following in your footsteps, and by our loving service to others; thereby proclaiming your Gospel in word and deed. Holy Spirit, Lift us up and be with us each day. Teach us, guide us and give us the courage to embrace stewardship as a way of life in Christ as we journey along our pilgrim way back to the Father. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with the Father and the Holy Spirit, One God, forever and ever.

Stewardship--Seventh Sunday of Easter June 1/2, 2019 In today's Gospel we go back to the time of the Last Supper where we hear the conclusion of Jesus' prayer before he goes to the Garden of Gethsemane. Jesus reveals a worldview in this prayer, a worldview that focuses on disciples both present to him at that moment and to follow after him in the future. It is a worldview that emphasizes unity among all Christians, a loving communion of followers of Christ who together, he prays, will become a visible sign of God's active presence in the world. We rejoice that Christ has risen, remains with us and continues to pray for unity among us. How might we respond to Jesus' prayer for unity? How can we work for unity among all followers of Jesus Christ?

The Ascension of the Lord -

Acts 1:1-11. Psalm 47:2-3, 6-7, 8-9. Ephesians 1:17-23. OR Hebrews 9:24-28: 10:19-23. Luke 24:46-53.

Going but not leaving. There is a paradox, a mystery, really, today. Jesus announces his going into heaven – but blesses his followers before leaving. This blessing clothes them – and us – in garments of Baptism so that we may witness to all things Christic in this world and in the next. This blessing clothes us in him.
