YEAR OF SAINT JOSEPH

On December 8, 2020, the 150th anniversary of the declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church, Pope Francis issued an Apostolic Letter entitled *Patris corde* ("With a Father's Heart"). In that beautiful letter, the Holy Father proclaimed a "Year of Saint Joseph" from December 8, 2020, to December 8, 2021 (See: vati-cannews.va). The Apostolic Penitentiary also issued a Decree granting plenary indulgences for this special year. There are various prayers and resources to celebrate this Year of Saint Joseph. The following is Pope Francis' Prayer to Saint Joseph.

Pope Francis' Prayer to Saint Joseph

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer,
Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary.
To you God entrusted his only Son;
