2021 Sunday Offering Envelopes—We have chosen a new offering envelope program with Our Sunday Visitor of Huntington, Indiana. This program offers our parish office a better means of address corrections, new parishioner start-up, and communication with our office computer programs. Blessing of a Home—Although there are fine texts for the blessing of homes, neither the *Book of Blessings* nor *Catholic Households Blessings and Prayers* explains the traditional method for blessing homes this day using incense, chalk (an incarnational image because it reminds us of the dust of the earth from which we were made), and "Jordan water." The chalk is used to mark over doorways. The numerals consecrate the new year. The initials remind us of the legendary names of the magi—Casper, Melchior, and Balthasar—and also stand for the Latin motto *Christos mansion benedict* ("May Christ bless the house"). We have available to you Epiphany Kits and instructions so you can bless your homes.

Feast of EPIPHANY (the Magi)

In choosing to be born for us, God chose to be known by us. He, therefore, reveals Himself in this way, in order that this great sacrament of His love may not be an occasion for us of great misunderstanding. Today the Magi find, crying in the manager, the one they have followed as He was shone in the sky. Today, the Magi see clearly, in swaddling clothes, the one they have long awaited as He lay hidden among the stars. Today the Magi gaze in deep wonder at what they see: heaven on earth, earth in heaven, man in God, God in man. One whom the whole universe cannot contain, now enclosed in a tiny body. As they look, they believe and do not question, as their symbolic gifts bear witness: incense for God, gold for a king, myrrh for one who is to die. So the Gentiles, who were the last, become now the first: the faith of the Magi is the first fruits of the belief of the Gentiles.

The Epiphany of the Lord, Solemnity – 03 Jan. 2021 Isaiah 60:1-6. Psalm 72:1-2, 7-8, 10-11, 12-13. Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6. Matthew 2:1-12.

Copartners in the Promise. The readings and this solemnity are filled with competing images and persons. Darkness and light. Christians of Jewish heritage and Gentiles. Chosen people and coheirs, copartners. Herod and the Magi. Epiphany teaches us this: all are members of the same body, all are coheirs of God's goodness, all are copartners in the promise of Christ Jesus.

- Like the Magi, how will I give homage to Christ today?
- Whom do I look down upon that I must see as a copartner with me?
- What treasure will I give away, will I offer to another?
