The Word of Life- "There is an everyday heroism, made up of gestures of sharing, big or small, which build up an authentic culture of life... Aspect of PALM – Symbol of JESUS Palm branches have long been associated with the triumphal entry into Jerusalem. The palm is the symbol of victory, conquest, and kingship. As a symbol for Jesus, the Prince of Peace, and Servant-King, the palm has added significance; for the palm, of all trees, is the servant tree. The palm offers shade for the weary. It is the source of food for the hungry. From it man obtains sugar, resin, and oil. Its branches are used for the weaving of baskets and for the thatching of roofs. The lofty palm suggests mastery and service. – E.T. Clapp.

Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion – 28 March 2021
PROCESSION: Mark 11:1-10 OR John 12:12-16.
MASS: Isaiah 50:4-7. Psalm 22:8-9, 17-18, 19-20, 23-24.
Philippians 2:6-11. Mark 14:1-15:47. Entering and Dying. This Holy Week begins with a festive entry into Jerusalem with cloaks spread around, with leafy branches waving, and with "Hosannas" crying out. But this all ends with suffering and death. How will spend this day and this week emptying myself as Jesus did? How can I, like Jesus, be more humble? How will I be obedient?

The Paschal Triduum – 01-04 April 2021 These Holy Three Days begin on Thursday with the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, continues with the Passion of the Lord on Friday, rests in the joyfully expectant paschal fast of Saturday and the Rites of Preparation with the elect, and comes to an end with the Easter Vigil, the Masses of Easter Day, and Evening Prayer. Plan to come if you are safely able.

Thursday of the Lord's Supper – Thurs., 01 April 2021
At the Evening Mass Exodus 12:1-8, 11-14. Psalm 116:12
-13, 15-16bc, 17-18. 1 Corinthians 11:23-26. John 13:1-15.
Waiting to Dine Again. This may be the second Easter Triduum in a row where many will not come to the church because of Covid-19 concerns. But we can all still be Church, be the People of God even if we are off the parish campus. How can we take the key elements of this evening and bring them to bear in real life? Washing Feet. How will I be of service, perhaps doing what others cannot or will not do? Eating and Drinking. How will I feed those still in desperate need? Honoring the Person of Christ. How will I respect everyone? Maybe start with one person.

The Passion of the Lord (Good Friday) 02 April 2021 Isaiah 52:13–53:12. Psalm 31:2, 6, 12-13, 15-16, 17, 25. Hebrews 4:14-16; 5:7-9. John 18:1–19:42.

Waiting to Embrace Again. Some cannot come to the church this day. COVID-19 still restricts us all in some to many ways. Though we might not pray at the parish cross this day, we can still stand in its shadow. Though his death was gruesome, that now empty cross is our sign of victory.
