Celebrate the Year of St. Joseph!

On December 8, 2020, Pope Francis declared a special Year of St. Joseph to run through December 8, 2021. This marks the 150th anniversary of the declaration of St. Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church by Pope Pius IX. Pope Francis began the year with a new Apostolic Letter entitled *Pa*tris Corde (With a Father's Heart). The Holy Father reflected that Covid-19 "has helped us see more clearly the importance of ordinary people who, though far from the limelight exercise patience and offer hope every day." St. Joseph is the epitome of the quiet, ordinary person moving behind the scenes – and yet he shapes all of human history with his quiet guidance, protection, holiness, and acceptance of God's will. "Go to Joseph with extreme confidence, because I do not remember having asked anything from St. Joseph, without having obtained it readily." St Padre Pio. Get to know St. Joseph. Everything we know about St. Joseph comes from scripture and tradition.

"As Lent is the time for greater love, listen to Jesus' thirst...'Repent and believe' Jesus tells us. What are we to repent? Our indifference, our hardness of heart. What are we to believe?
