At the Easter Vigil, Father will bless the Easter Candle and the Holy Water. We will have small bottles for anyone wanting to take some Holy Water home with them after Mass. The water itself is not magic. Its power depends on the prayers, faith and devotion of the person who uses it. In making the Sign of the Cross with holy water, one expresses faith in God as Father, God as Son, and God as Holy Spirit and asks God's blessing in the name of the same three divine persons. This ritual action of blessing oneself also serves as a reminder of ones baptism. Benefits of using Holy Water are reminding us of our Baptismal promises, privileges and obligations. It is enabling us to open our hearts for the presence of God's grace. Use in a reasonable way.
