Third Sunday of Lent – 20 March 2022

Exodus 3:1-8a, 13-15. Psalm 103:1-2, 3-4, 6-7, 8, 11. 1 Corinthians 10:1-6, 10-12. Luke 13:1-9.

Reflecting on a Tree and a Bush. In Luke's parable, the gardener wants to give the unproductive fig tree a second chance. Here is an image of God's tending to all of us – always wanting the opportunity for second (and third and fourth and...) chances. In the Exodus account, God, in an unconsumed burning bush, speaks to Moses. Both vine-yard and Horeb are holy ground, places for God's saving activity.

- How will I work the holy ground of my life this week, this Lent?
- What fruit will my life bear?
- How will I listen and respond to what God calls out to me?
