forward to seeing all our Religious Ed. Families. If you have any question, please contact our RE Director, Susan Tjelle at 815-823-9376.





A silver rose on a nine-month pilgrimage will be the centerpiece of a special prayer service at Immaculate Conception Parish in Braidwood on Saturday Sept. 3rd from 9:00 to 10:00am. IC Braidwood and K of C Council 1574 were cho-

sen as a stop on the Silver Rose's pilgrimage to honor Our Lady of Guadalupe and express both international unity and dedication to the sanctity of human life. The journey of the silver rose begins each year in March and ends on Dec. 12, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. During that time, Silver Roses travel from town to town along eight routes throughout North America starting in Canada and making their way through the US and Mexico to The Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City on Our Lady's feast day.
