

Dear Friends,

On October 23, we celebrate World Mission Sunday, when we join Catholics worldwide in supporting the missionary work of the Church.

Pope Francis draws inspiration from the Acts of the Apostles for the theme of this year's World Mission Sunday: "You shall be my witnesses" (Acts 1:8). In his message, he notes the work of Blessed Pauline Jancot, a young French woman who founded the Society for the Propagation of the Faith 200 years ago: "She accepted God's inspiration to establish a network of prayer and collection for missionaries, so that the faithful could actively participate in the mission 'to the ends of the earth." Her vision would lead to World Missior Sunday.

Your donations and prayers support priests, religious and lay pastoral leaders in more than 1,100 mission dioceses in Asia, Africa, the Pacific Islands, and parts of Latin America and Europe as they proclaim the Gospel, build the Church, and serve the poor.

When you contribute to the World Mission Sunday collection, you make it possible for the Holy Father and our Diocese of Joliet missions to provide for the formation of our seminarians and religious men and women.
