From the Diocese... Beginning in 2016, the Diocese of Joliet began a quiet campaign called "I Will Give You Shepherds" to benefit Seminarian Education and has raised \$10.2 million to date. Due to the pandemic, the campaign was put on hold. It is now time to reopen the campaign and invite parishioners to help us reach our goal of \$15 million. At the request of Bishop Hicks, all parishes will be conducting a Second Collection to raise funds for the Seminarian Education Endowment Campaign, "I Will Give You Shepherds." The **Second Collection** will take place the weekend of **November 12-13, 2022**. The funds collected by each parish will be handled in the same manner as all second collections, with each parish sending one check to the diocese.
