Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time-17 Sept 2023 Sirach 27:30–28:7. Psalm 103:1-2, 3-4, 9-10, 11-12. Romans 14:7-9. Matthew 18:21-35. Seventy-Seven Times. When is enough enough? Can we be angry now? When can we stop forgiving? If we have to forgive the same person the same thing seventy-seven times, can we stop at seventy-eight? No! Because, as Paul declares in Romans 14, we live and die for God, to whom alone we belong. We do not live for ourselves. Who needs my forgiveness? Whom will I forgive – and for what – perhaps, again? And what forgiveness do I need?
